

SUMMARY: The excerpt below from a letter written on 8 July 1574 by the French ambassador to England, Bertrand de Salignac Fenelon (1523-1589), seigneur de la Mothe, to Queen Catherine de Medici, Regent of France, reports Oxford's flight to the continent on 1 July 1574, and the consternation his sudden departure has caused at court.

And I will add only that on Saturday last the Earl of Oxford and my Lord Edward Somerset [sic] slipped away from here to pass to Flanders, with which this court is much troubled.

The 8<sup>th</sup> day of July 1574

. . . Et adjouxteray seulement que, samedy dernier, le comte d'Oxford et milord Edward de Sommerset se sont desrobez d'icy pour passer en Flandres, de quoy ceste court est assez troublée.
