
SUMMARY: The document below summarizes a letter dated 27 May 1583 written from the court at Greenwich by Rogers Manners to Edward Manners (1549–1587), 3rd Earl of Rutland. Roger Manners (c.1536–1607), courtier and landowner, was the third son of Thomas Manners (c.1497–1543), 1st Earl of Rutland, and the uncle of the letter's recipient, Edward Manners (1549–1587), 3rd Earl of Rutland.
