## CHRONOLOGY OF PRINTING OF THE MARPRELATE AND RELATED TRACTS

| February 28, 1587    | Penry presents petition to Parliament along with a copy of his <u>Aequity</u> , printed by Joseph Barnes at Oxford.   |

| February-March, 1588 | Penry's Exhortation printed.  |
| April, 1588          | Waldegrave prints the anonymous <u>State of the Church Laid Open</u> (Diotrephes' Dialogue), perhaps written by Martin Marprelate, at his shop in London.   |
| April 16, 1588       | Waldegrave's press seized.  |
| May, 1588            | Second edition of Penry's Exhortation printed.  |
| May 13, 1588         | State of the Church Laid Open burned, and Waldegrave's press destroyed.   |
| mid-July, 1588       | Waldegrave and Penry print Penry's <u>Defence</u> at Mistress Crane's manor of East Molesey Priory across the Thames from Hampton Court palace.   |
| October, 1588        | Waldegrave prints Martin's <u>Epistle</u> and Udall's <u>Demonstration</u> at Mistress Crane's manor of East Molesey Priory.  |
| November, 1588       | Waldegrave prints Martin's <u>Epitome</u> at Sir Richard Knightley's manor of Fawsley in Northamptonshire.  |
| late January, 1589   | Waldegrave prints Martin's <u>Certain Mineral and Metaphysical School-points</u> at John Hales' property, the Whitefriars in Coventry.  |
| March, 1589          | Waldegrave prints Penry's <u>View of Some Part of Such Public Wants</u> and Martin's <u>Hay Any Work For Cooper</u> at the Whitefriars.   |
| April, 1588          | Waldegrave leaves for Devonshire.   |
| May-August, 1589     | Waldegrave prints the anonymous <u>Dialogue Wherein Is Plainly Laid Open</u> and <u>Master Some Laid Open In His Colours</u> (both probably written by Martin Marprelate) at La Rochelle in France, as well as Penry's <u>Appellation</u> . |
| late July, 1589      | Hodgkins prints Martin's <u>Theses Martinianae</u> and his <u>Just Censure and Reproof</u> of Martin Junior at Sir Roger Wigston's manor of Wolston Priory.   |
| July 29, 1589        | Hodgkins and his assistants depart for Manchester.  |
| August 14, 1589      | Earl of Derby's men seize press and type at Newton Lane in Manchester, together with the manuscript of More Work For Cooper. Hodgkins and his two assistants taken into custody.  |
| September, 1589      | Martin's <u>Protestation</u> printed at Wolston Priory by Throckmorton and Penry, assisted in the latter stages by Waldegrave.  |
