SUMMARY: The document below is an accounting for repairs done at Colne House in October 1563 and from January to March 1564 under the supervision of Jasper Jones, then clerk of the kitchen to Oxford's mother, Margery, Countess of Oxford, as well as repairs done under the supervision of a Mr Petch, Lady Margery's then bailiff, from March 1564 onward. It would appear from one of the entries below that Lady Margery came to live at Colne House in October 1563. For an earlier document from June 1563 noting the need for repairs at Colne House, see TNA SP 12/29/14, ff. 21-2.
