SUMMARY: The document below is an entry, dated 22 May 1604, in a docket-book of a warrant to the Exchequer authorizing payment to Oxford of £200 for his fees claimed at the coronation. For Oxford's claims to act as Great Chamberlain and Queen's Chamberlain at the coronation, see TNA SP 14/2/76, ff. 187-207.

A docket is defined in the *Oxford English Dictionary* as 'a brief summarized statement', and specifically as 'the abstract of a proposed letter patent written upon the King's bill which authorized the preparation of such letter for the Great Seal, and also copied into a register or docket-book'.

The other entries for 22 May 1604 in the docket-book have not been transcribed below.

A warrant to the Exchequer to pay to the Earl of Oxford or to his assign the sum of £200 for satisfaction of certain fees claimed by the said Earl at his Majesty's coronation, and compounded for by his Majesty's Commissioners in that behalf.
